Plants

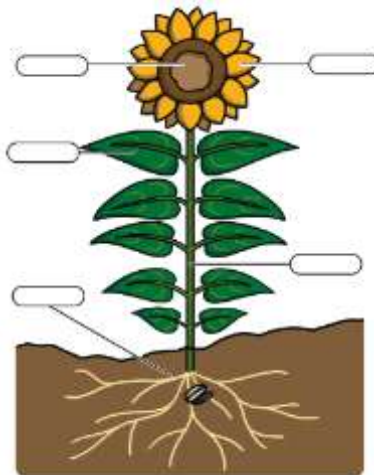


What's the difference between an evergreen and deciduous tree?

Science focus – plants

plant	Living things that grow from the soil and use sunlight to make food.
bulb	The underground stem and food storage which some plants grow from.
seed	A small, round object that is produced from a plant. When it is planted, a new plant can grow.
stem	The part of the plant that is seen above the soil. The stem holds the leaves, fruit and flower.
roots	The part of the plant that takes in water from the soil and holds it in place.
leaf	The flat leaves grow from the stem and make food from sunlight.

Geography focus – comparing the UK to South Africa

continent	A large solid area of land on earth. These include Asia, Europe, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica and Oceania.
oceans	The salt water between continents.
South Africa	A country in the southern part of the continent Africa.
United Kingdom	An island country made up of four parts.
human feature	Things that have been made by humans, e.g. roads.
physical feature	The natural features on the Earth's surface, e.g. mountains.
