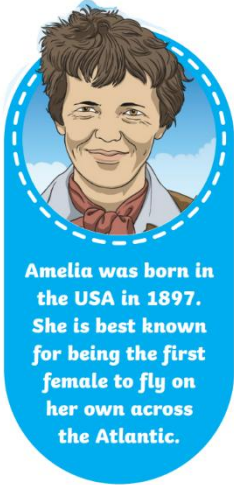

History -Key Vocabulary

pioneer	The first person to do something, such as explore new territory, test a theory or create a product.
voyage	A long journey or trip, usually by sea or in space.
past	Something that has already happened.
present	Something that is happening now.
expedition	An exciting trip or journey taken by a group of people to explore or discover new places.
source	An object, picture or book that gives us clues about the past.

Amelia began to fly when she was 23 years old.

She got her first plane in 1921.

She got her permit to fly in 1923.

She was the first female to fly on her own across the Atlantic in 1932.

Science - Key Vocabulary

experiment	To carry out a test to find the answer to a question.
predict	To use what I know to have a guess about what I think will happen.
observe	To look closely at what is happening.
results	The recording of what has happened in my experiment, for example amounts of time or length.
conclusion	What I have found out from my experiment.
equipment	What I will need to carry out my experiment.
